Founded in 1897, the RP Home has been part of the fabric of the Northside ever since. Given the opportunity to move into the North Hills during the 1980s, we declined, saying, "The Northside is *Our Home!*"

At RPH Senior Living, we strive to make the Northside a better place to live in the following ways:

We have been a local economic engine for 115 years:

- Currently, more than 55% of our employees live on the Northside
- We contract with 13 Northside vendors
- We offer affordable childcare for the working parents from the RP Home and surrounding Northside neighborhoods

We provide affordable Quality Care and Services for Older Adults:

- RPH Senior Living currently serves 121 residents
- Our clinical team is led by Linda Long, the VP of the Pennsylvania Association of Directors of Nursing Administration
- Our quality care is demonstrated by statistics which meet or exceed state and national averages
- We offer housekeeping, daily meals, laundry rooms or laundry services, beauty salon services, library, chapel, weekly shopping trips, clubs, and on and off-campus cultural programs
- Our benevolent care for residents without resources exceeded \$1,000,000 in 2011

We provide Access to Educational Opportunities:

- We are a clinical rotation site for students from the Duquesne University School of Nursing
- We are an internship location for students from the University of Pittsburgh School of Social Work and divinity students from the Reformed Presbyterian Theological Seminary
- We offer work site training for students from McNaugher School
- More than 55 volunteers donate their time to RP Home annually
- Lecture series open to the public

We partner with Various Community and Youth Groups:

- We have an on-going relationship with the Pittsburgh Project
- Our CFO, Bill Weir, served on the Board of the Perry Hilltop Citizen's Council for 15 years
- We partner with the Western PA Conservancy to beautify our neighborhood
- We offer engaging public programs such as Gardening Day and the Walker Country Fair
- We offer meeting space for local community groups
- We are a work site for Pittsburgh Cares (Volunteering Made Easy)
- US Department for Housing and Urban Development provided the major grant for construction of campus subsidized senior apartments, the Upper Rooms.
