RENEW, REBUILD, & REJUVENATE

REFLECTIONS BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

We are looking to 2022 as a year to renew, rebuild and rejuvenate as the Reformed Presbyterian Woman's Association celebrates 125 years of service.

The Reformed Presbyterian Home opened its door in 1897 on the North Side of Pittsburgh (then known as Allegheny City) and has been operating on the corner of Perrysville Ave and Burgess Street since 1907. Today, we provide independent living, low-income housing, personal care services and nursing services to the local community and to members of the Reformed Presbyterian Church.

Things have changed since the days when people would take a carriage to the RP Home, when male residents would care for the cow and chickens, or when friends brought their produce for meals. Regardless of the changes in healthcare, funding, and technology, we continue to serve our mission and maintain a commitment to providing benevolent and uncompensated care. In 2021, RP Home provided \$2.2 million in benevolent and uncompensated care. We rely on the generosity of others to help make this possible. More than 60% of our resident population depends on Medicaid funding, and the Pennsylvania Medicaid system vastly underfunds facilities such as ours to provide these services.

After spending the last two years maintaining COVID precautions, we believe 2022 is a great time to <u>renew</u> RP Home's connection with the community. We look forward to providing various communication educational events on topics such as hospice services, insurance, and advanced directives. In addition, we are planning a Founder's Day Celebration in June and other community events throughout the year.

The COVID-19 pandemic did not delay facility improvements. We continued to improve our home in 2021 by repainting resident rooms, installing new privacy curtains and resident blinds, and updating our heating and cooling system. RP Home is in the process of planning to <u>rebuild</u> our Resident Chapel and Community Space in 2022.

We are thankful for the financial generosity and time of our donors, mission partners and volunteers, whose contributions made it possible for us to continue to <u>rejuvenate</u> our physical, mental, social and spiritual programs. Thanks to the generosity of our supporters we have been able to expand our technology to monitor physical and medical conditions as well as to advance our therapy treatment programs. In addition, the Reformed Presbyterian Home received funding in 2021 to support the expansion of our spiritual program and end of life program.

The Reformed Presbyterian Home remains committed to providing a supportive living environment to those who call us "home."

ABOUT THE MEETING

The annual association meeting for the RPWA will be held on Thursday April 28, 2022 at the RP Home. If you are familiar with the work, we urge you to join and hear how God is working at the RP Home. The purpose of the meeting is an opportunity of the Executive Director, the financial auditors and the Board Committees to share the work of 2021 and the plan for the future. There will also be an election of Board members and approval of changes to the Bylaws. You can find a draft of the proposed Bylaws at www.rphome.org/ for your review in advance of the meeting.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE SUMMARY OF PROPOSED BYLAWS AMENDMENTS FOR ADOPTION AT THE 2022 ANNUAL MEETING

The Governance Committee is submitting this summary as a cover document to the Proposed Bylaws Amendments to be approved at the February 18, 2022, regular board meeting and to be adopted at the RPWA Annual Meeting on April 28, 2022. It will also accompany the Proposed Bylaws Amendments that Cara Todhunter will send to each congregation of the RPCNA at least fifteen days prior to the RPWA Annual Meeting and posted on the RP Home website. The summary is provided because the changes are extensive this year.

Summary of the main proposed amendments:

- Article I, Section 4, provides a more realistic method of determining who has paid annual RPWA membership dues.
- Article II, Sections 1 and 2, change the notification process for RPWA Annual Meetings and Special Meetings so that all congregations in the RPCNA, not just congregations in the Presbytery of the Alleghenies, will be informed. Notification will no longer be required in Good Tidings. (Email, the RP Home website, and social media will be used, although this is not specifically stated in the amendments.)
- Article II, Section 3 (Annual Meetings); Article III, Section 6 (Board Meetings); Article VI, Section 2 (Executive Committee Meetings); Article VI, Section 2 (Executive

Committee Meetings); and Article VI, Section 4 (Standing Committees and Special Committees) authorize remote, or electronic, meetings, as well as in-person meetings or a combination of the two types.

Robert's Rule of Order Newly Revised, 12th Edition, states that an organization's bylaws must include authorization to hold remote, or electronic, meetings if it plans to use technology, such as Zoom or teleconference. (Exceptions can be made in the case of emergencies, according to legal counsel.)

• Article XI changes the number of days for submitting proposed amendments to the Board of Directors for approval and for sending proposed amendments to each RPCNA congregation.

Summary of Additional Changes:

- Article II, Section 5, and Article IV, Section 2, change the number of members of the Nominating Committee from three to an unspecified number because the number of members on the Governance Committee, which serves as the Nominating Committee, has fluctuated.
- Article III, Sections 3, 4, 6, and 8 include changes for clarification purposes and to correspond with formal English standards.
- Articles V and IX change the title of Chief Financial Officer to Director of Finance.
