Dear Friends of the RP Home,

We are inviting you to join us in contributing to the 125th Anniversary Capital Campaign to renovate the Chapel at the Reformed Presbyterian Home.

As the spiritual center and social center of the Home, The Chapel is a unique space where both beauty and functionality are necessities. It is constantly in use with activities scheduled seven days a week—worship services, funerals, entertainments, crafting events, birthday parties, and neighborhood meetings.

Renovation will be thorough. No surface will be left untouched. Furniture will be comfortable and attractive. The latest in lighting and sound equipment will accommodate those with hearing or vision limitations. Heating and cooling will be modernized. Spaces adjacent to the Chapel will be included in the upgrade. A small private room for meditation and family visits will be added



next door. Restrooms will be all new. And most importantly, the entrance from the elevator will be modified to ease access by those in wheelchairs.

These renovations will ensure that the Chapel remains an important and accessible space where residents and their families can enjoy each other's company in attractive, comfortable surroundings.

Transformation this thorough is expensive, and our total project cost is \$500,000.

The RP Home appreciates the presence of our residents, staff, and visitors for this event and for their continued support. The generosity of others allows the Reformed Presbyterian Home to continue serving seniors and providing benevolent care for those who cannot financially support their care needs. The offerings received at the annual Thankoffering service are undesignated gifts supporting the Gracious Giving, Grateful Living benevolent care fund.

In the last calendar year, the total amount of uncompensated care provided by the RP Home amounted to \$2,207,583, consisting of \$130,344 in benevolent care and \$2,077,239 in contractual adjustments for Medicare, Medical Assistance, and commercial insurance.

At the start of our career, Tina obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Social Work from the University of Pittsburgh. Although she is now retired (after 32 years of work with the U.S. Postal Service), Tina continues to volunteer at RP Home and uses her education as a social worker to give back to her community.
