# REFLECTIONS BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

#### Dear Friends,

2023 has been a very busy and successful year for the Reformed Presbyterian Home (RP Home). In addition to focusing on the continuum of care offered by RP Home itself, we have engaged with community members, celebrated staff milestones, and prepared to break ground on various physical improvements to the Home in 2024.

As I look back on what we accomplished and observed this year, these highlights come to my mind:

#### **Community Education Opportunities**

We continued in our commitment to providing educational services to our community and neighbors. In conjunction with other community partners, we had the privilege of presenting on topics such as Dementia Friends, Planning for End of Life, and Insurance Open Enrollment throughout the year.

#### **Capital Campaign Updates**

We have also focused on important improvements and renovations of the Home itself in 2023. Through our





50th anniversary Capital Campaign, we received financial support for the renovation of our Community Room and Chapel from individual donors and various foundations. With their support, we have raised \$440,000 of our \$500,000 goal!

What does this mean? It means we have reached the point where we can begin the reconstruction of the heart of our home. Work on the Community Room and Chapel is expected to begin in January 2024.

We are grateful to the individual donors, organizations, and foundations who have supported our goal to improve "the heart of the home" for our community. We look forward to hosting a ribbon cutting event in the spring of 2024.

#### **Additional Renovation Plans**

We recently received financial support to renovate the 3rd floor of the nursing community. We look forward to beginning this project in the spring of 2024.



#### **Major Staff Milestones**

This year we celebrated the employment milestones of 9 employees, one of whom has served for 30 years! It is the dedication of our staff who help deliver RP Home's mission every day, and it was our pleasure to celebrate the dedication of our staff this year.

#### 2023's Walker Celebration of Lights

On Thursday, December 7, we hosted the Walker Celebration of Lights. During the event we rang in the holiday season with entertainment by Deborah Moncrief, refreshments, crafts, music, and photo opportunities. ## GIVING THROUGH YOUR WILL TO BENEFIT REFORMED PRESBYTERIAN HOME

A gift in your will — also known as a bequest — is one of the easier and most effective ways to give to RP Home, or to any charity of your choice (a church, school, animal rescue, etc.). They are also known as "legacy gifts" because they are a way for you to leave your legacy in the world.

#### In as little as one sentence, you can complete such a gift.

Not surprisingly, such bequests can be an important source of financial resources for RP Home, as well as all nonprofit organizations. Donations in your will help ensure your favorite charity continues its mission for years to come. It is also a way for you to replace the yearly gifts you may have been making.

# A bequest may be right for you if:

- You want to make a gift to a nonprofit organization
- You want the flexibility to change your mind
- You want continued access to your wealth, should you need it
- You are concerned about outliving your resources

# Charitable gifts after death also have the power to reduce estate taxes.

Because your bequest is revocable, you do not receive an income tax charitable deduction when you create it. Rather, your estate will receive an estate tax deduction for the full value of your bequest in the year it is made. Depending on a variety of factors, including the size of your estate and estate tax law at the time your estate is settled, this deduction may or may not save estate taxes.

#### If you are thinking about your legacy and want to incorporate a gift to one or more of your favorite charities, a RP Home staff member would be happy to help you.

This is important because your bequest must be accurately and clearly described in your estate plan so your wishes can be carried out as you intend.

We will help you add a provision in your will or trust designating either a percentage, specific amount, or all or a portion of the residue of your estate. To avoid any possible question that your bequest is to the right organization, you will want to include the organization's full legal name and federal tax identification number in your bequest. We can provide you with this information as well as sample bequest language to assist you and your attorney.

#### With a bequest gift, you have complete flexibility to change your bequest at any time.

If circumstances change in a way that makes you want to revise your gift, you can. No other planned gift is as simple to make or as easy to change should you ever need the assets during your lifetime.

#### A charitable bequest could be the most important gift you ever make and one of the easiest.

If you already have a will, you can modify it to include a gift to RP Home, and your other cherished nonprofit organizations. If you don't have a will, you can create one using many available free online tools.

Putting a charitable gift in your will doesn't require much time, and it doesn't require a lot of money. Bequests of any amount can have an impact far greater and more lasting than you might expect. Those who include a charitable bequest in their estate plans become immortalized within the causes, the organizations, and the community they support.
